Salih Booker

Mr. Booker is the Executive Director of Africa Action, the oldest organization in the U.S. working on African affairs. From 1995 through 1999, Mr. Booker directed the Council on Foreign Relations Africa Studies Program. He has served as a professional staff member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs in the U.S. Congress (1983-86 and 1990), and as a Program Officer for the Ford Foundation in Eastern and Southern Africa, (1986-88). He was also an Associate Director for the Catholic Relief Services' Southern Africa Office (1991), and a Legislative Assistant for TransAfrica (1980-1983).

Mr. Booker has worked in Africa and the United States as a consultant for numerous international donor institutions and African NGOs, including the United Nations Development Program, the African Development Foundation and Africare. During the past 24 years, Mr. Booker has traveled to and worked in 26 of Africa's 54 countries. He lived in Ghana, Kenya and Zimbabwe during 10 of those years. He became a member of Amnesty International USA's Economic Social and Cultural Rights Advisory Committee in 2004. Mr. Booker was educated at Wesleyan University, the University of Ghana, and the London School of Economics and Political Science.
